Dear Parents,

Our school prides itself on preparing our students for the digital age and in doing so, all students in Year 5 and Year 6 will participate in a BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) One-to-One Laptop Program in 2024.

The program is a continuation of the BYOD program students in Year 5 currently participate in. The BYOD acronym used by the department refers to the teaching and learning environment in Queensland State Schools where personally-owned mobile devices are used to access the department's information and communication (ICT) network. It is important to note that at Fitzgerald State School, digital devices specify laptops only to assist with consistency in application to teaching and learning in a primary setting.

EXPECTATIONS:

The following details are included within this letter to provide basic information at this stage, regarding the program. The laptop will need to meet the Fitzgerald State School required system specifications before it can be accepted into the program (specifications attached). Providing a laptop that is more than 3 years old will disadvantage your child's education as it will not perform sufficiently with the school's network. The BYOD laptop can be further utilised once the student enters high school. Laptops used currently by Year 5 students will be suitable for Year 6.

Students with a BYOD laptop are responsible for all technical issues and the care and management of the laptop. Laptops are to arrive fully charged ready to use each day. Families need to provide an appropriate laptop bag which is designed for laptop transport. Families are responsible for the insurance of the laptop.

If you have significant concerns with the program due to financial hardship, please contact Mrs Tracey Adams, Principal to discuss how the school may be able to support you to engage with this program. All supporting information can be located on the school website. A BYO fact sheet and set up guide will be provided later in the year while more specific information for student use will be discussed at the start of the new year. Enrolling your student's BYOD Laptop to Fitzgerald State School

Enrolling to Fitzgerald State School's network will **NOT** be able to begin until school returns in 2024. This is due to students requiring new passwords at the beginning of each year.

In the first week of Term 1 Years 5 & 6 students will be provided with their EQ Username, Password, a complete step by step guide on how to enrolling their BYOD laptop and the Fitzgerald State School BYOD Charter for 2024.

Fitzgerald State School uses Microsoft Intune software which is a secure mobile management system that allows personal devices to use school Wi-Fi, emails, learning applications and websites.

There is no cost for your student to use Microsoft Intune and Microsoft Office 365. Any additional software required for classroom activities and assessments will be provided and managed by Fitzgerald State School. It is recommended to purchase a suitable Anti-Virus software.

Parental controls can be used in conjunction with Microsoft Intune. Windows has Microsoft Family to manage screen time, block and manage apps and features on your student's device.
